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**BREATHE:
Breathing and Respiratory Education
and Training for cancer Healthcare
professionals E-learning programme.**



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BREATHE: Context

- **Lung cancer- 3rd most commonly diagnosed cancer in the EU (243,600 in 2000).**
- **Most common cause of death from cancer in the EU.**
- **15-70% of patients with advanced cancer have respiratory problems.**
- **Co-morbidity and complexity of symptoms.**



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BREATHE is an education project focusing on the care of people with lung cancer and specifically the management of symptoms in advanced lung cancer.



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Three phases:

- ✓ **Reviewing literature and policy.**
- Identifying resources.
- ✓ **Assessing the learning needs of nurses who manage acute and palliative respiratory symptoms as a result of advanced disease.**
- Training needs analysis
- ✓ **Developing learning resources to help professionals enhance their knowledge and skills.**
- Education resource.



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Questionnaires were distributed via EONS networks.

100 replies were received, including:

- 58 via email**
- 42 via paper copies**

Replies were received from:

- United Kingdom**
- Republic of Ireland**
- Spain**
- Portugal**
- Germany**



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- ✓ **The survey offered useful insights into the background and experience of respondents, level of knowledge and priorities for learning.**
- ✓ **This will provide a useful basis from which to develop the BREATHE Education Programme.**
- ✓ **The potential diversity of the perspectives from which respondents answered should be acknowledged, e.g. variation in treatment regimes.**



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ABOUT THE RESPONDENTS:

- ✓ **Most had years of experience working with lung cancer patients, over 90% for > 2 years and three quarters for > 5 years. 90% had worked with 30 or more individuals.**
- ✓ **Worked in a range of settings, half within Specialist Cancer Services, just under a third in General Hospital and under 10% in patients' homes or Specialist Pulmonology/Lung Centre.**
- ✓ **Just over half worked at giving vital care and support . One third were involved in symptom management. 11% were advanced practitioners or nurse consultants.**



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KNOWLEDGE & SKILLS

- **The knowledge questions were answered correctly by the majority of respondents but the percentage of correct answers to some question was only 63%.**
- **Knowledge on the effects of smoking cessation was particularly lacking, with virtually one third of respondents answering the question incorrectly.**
- **All of the topics listed on the questionnaire were identified as a learning priority and the spread was broad.**



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NURSING PRACTICE

- **The nursing practice of virtually three quarters of respondents is influenced by national guidelines or protocols.**
- **Co-existing disease is recognised as an issue for respondents, particularly chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and cardiovascular problems.**



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LEARNING

- ✓ **83% had undergone education about lung cancer within the last 2 years but 16% had none.**
- ✓ **Preferred learning methods for 75% included some face to face teaching. 40% identifying that pre- and post-course materials would be helpful. 11% would be happy with e-learning and 7% with distance learning.**
- ✓ **84% had access to computers and two thirds had ready access to local clinicians for support with learning. Only 7% had limited or no access.**



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ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

- **Some respondents described aspects of their work or roles.**
- **Some identified the lack of knowledge and skills on lung cancer within their services and the need for BREATHE.**
- **Other priorities for learning identified included family genetics, mesothelioma, patient expectations the roles of different specialist nurses.**
- **Not all were nurses, they included two physiotherapists and an occupational therapist.**



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IMPLICATIONS: RESPONDENTS

- **The BREATHE Education Programme should therefore be applicable to care in a range of settings.**
- **The results confirm that the BREATHE Programme should aim to be accessible to practitioners working at all levels, including fundamental care, but should also offer learning which will be of value to advanced practitioners and nurse consultants.**
- **Despite most of the sample having considerable experience they want, and in some cases need, to enhance their knowledge and skills in this area. Evidence of the need for the BREATHE Programme.**



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IMPLICATIONS: KNOWLEDGE

- **The knowledge questions were structured in order to sample respondent understanding around risk of lung cancer, biology of lung cancer development, spread and staging and how lifestyle specifically smoking behaviour can influence disease progress and treatment outcomes. The responses to the questionnaire suggest that all of these aspects should be integral to the BREATHE Education Programme.**
- **The effects of smoking and smoking cessation were highlighted as a priority area where understanding needs to be enhanced.**



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IMPLICATIONS: SKILLS

- **All skills listed should be included in the Education programme.**
- **Priorities focus around symptom management.**
- ? **offer some fundamental elements or modules, e.g. in the biology of lung cancer, recognising and managing symptoms of lung cancer, supporting people with lung cancer and the range of treatments and interventions.**
- ? **range of 'module' options for advanced level practitioners and nurse consultants who wish to develop particular expertise.**

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IMPLICATIONS: LEARNING

The responses identify a need for the BREATHE Education Programme and that the majority of respondents would be able to undertake e-learning, although most would prefer pre- and post-course materials with some face-to-face teaching.



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IMPLICATIONS: LEARNING

- **The programme should include aspects of managing disease which co-exists with lung cancer, particularly among older people, particularly chronic airways disease and cardiovascular problems.**
- **From responses, other elements of the programme should include breathing retraining, improving exercise tolerance, energy conservation, activity management, managing acute symptoms, psychosocial interventions, practice advice such as identifying locally available help and promoting enjoyable pastimes, and also developing a therapeutic relationship with patient and carer.**
