

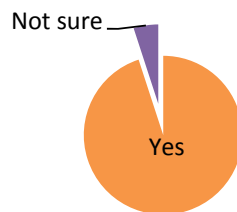
## Evaluation EONS Research Proposal Workshop 2011 – 2014

Questionnaire sent to 29 participants from the workshops held in 2011, 2012 and 2014 (79% response rate)

### What did you gain from the workshop?

- 57% great facilitators
- 39% networking & learning from colleagues
- 30% increased knowledge about research
- 22% encouragement for research topic
- 22% time to focus on research proposal
- 13% learn more about methodology
- 13% learn more about funding
- 13% increased self-confidence

### Should we continue with the workshop?



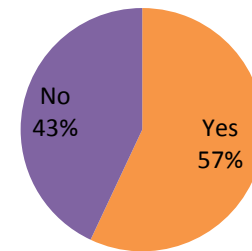
Because:

- Realisation of how important research is for practice 80%
- Networking 33%
- Useful start-up 13%
- Toolkit 7%
- Make clear it's for novice researchers 7%

### Did the workshop contribute to your development?

- 41% got another job (assoc. prof, PhD-student)
- 36% said it helped them with their research proposal
- 32% increased their self-confidence & interest in research
- 18% presented & published research findings
- 18% achieved 'recognition for research' at work

### Have you developed your research idea into a proposal?



Yes,

- Proposal is funded (n=3)
- Submitted, but not funded (n=3)
- Still plan to submit for funding (n=3)
- Project started that is unfunded (n=6)

No,

- No time, too much clinical work (n=6)
- Personal circumstances (n=5)
- Changed research ideas (n=4)
- No funding, so no facilities (n=3)

### 40% developed another research proposal

#### Ideas to encourage nurses to be more research active?

- Research funding
- Encourage clinical nurses to join the workshop
- Develop a research directory
- Promote studies in different countries
- Differentiation between levels in workshop (e.g. nurses; researchers)
- Promoting research by national societies
- Use successful stories for promotion
