I would like to become an EONS Board Member because (600 words max):

Clinical practice and patient care are at the heart of oncology nursing. This invaluable and rewarding fulfilling work must take place in a healthy, safe and evidence-based environment. I myself have been working in clinical practice for almost 30 years, using my expertise as an advanced practice nurse in German-speaking countries to improve these standards. Unfortunately, there is still much progress to be made. That's why I joined EONS a few years ago and became a member of the Education Working Group. One of the reasons I did this was because I think the EONS framework for oncology nursing and programmes like TITAN or Target are incredibly important for clinical practice. I really wanted to be a part of that and help shape those programmes. What I found at EONS was an incredible sense of belonging with my international colleagues. My involvement in the EWG has deepened over time, and I now serve as Co-Chair of the EWG and Chair of the European College of Cancer Nursing Task Group. I am also involved in the Masterclass in Oncology Nursing for the third time, this year as chair. It seemed a logical step to apply for the EONS Board now. As Co-Chair of the EWG, I would not only be able to implement the decisions of the EONS Board, but I would also be able to help shape them. This is important in terms of clinical practice and working with patients.

My aims during my term on the Board of EONS would be (300 words max):

My primary goal on the EONS Board is to fulfil the expectations defined by EONS for a Board Member-at-Large for Education. Based on my many years of membership in the EWG and my role as co-chair, I believe that this primary goal is well achievable.

Other aims are:

- Work with all working groups and board members to support the implementation of the EONS strategy.
- Visibility, audibility and palpability of oncology nursing in all relevant committees. Wherever oncology nursing is discussed, EONS must be at the table.
- To always represent the voice of clinical practice at EONS and across Europe.
- To ensure the safety of oncology nurses in their workplace.
- To initiate and contribute to the development of evidence-based educational initiatives for clinical practice.
- To share my experience with Young Cancer Nurses.

The skills and experience that I would be able to bring to the role are (800 words max):

I can bring to the EONS Board skills and experience developed in nearly 30 years in my professional career: as an oncology nurse, as a pedagogue and as a scientist in clinical practice.

As a nurse, I have nearly 30 years of continuous professional experience in oncology and haematology nursing. For the last 27 years, I have been working to improve the working conditions of oncology nurses in German-speaking countries. Examples include the safe administration of cytostatics and the accreditation of comprehensive cancer centres in Germany and Switzerland. In 2007 I started to develop my role as a advanced practice nurse for patients with multiple myeloma and cellular therapies, first in Freiburg, Germany, then in Zurich and now in St. Gallen, Switzerland.

As a pedagogue, I started supervising nursing students in the clinical setting 28 years ago. After studying pedagogy, I was responsible for the theoretical and practical training of oncology nurses. This training was based on the EONS framework and was accredited by EONS. I have also been a lecturer at various German and Swiss universities for over 14 years. My main topics are patient education, symptom management, advanced nursing practice and occupational safety with cytotoxic drugs. One of my seminars is based on the Cancer Care and Safety module of the EONS framework. I have been running courses on the safe administration of chemotherapy throughout Germany for five years. In addition, I have authored more than 50 publications on oncology topics in German nursing journals and have presented at all relevant national and international oncology nursing conferences, including EONS, EBMT, and the International Myeloma Society meetings. All this work has resulted in a worldwide network that is very useful in my daily work.

As an advanced practice nurse, I am committed to good symptom control. It's about bringing science into clinical practice, making it explainable and then developing symptom management interventions in clinical practice. However, it is equally important to bring clinical practice into science where there is no evidence. To do this, I bring potential research questions to universities and support masters students working on these questions.

Not forgetting my personal skills. As a father of four children, I have learnt to be calm and collected and to work as part of a team to find solutions that work for everyone.
